Hours & Schedule

Families of all income levels are welcome at PIC. We accept applications from families who receive state subsidies to help meet their child care expenses, which includes Pennsylvania's Pre-K Counts and the Child Care Information Service (CCIS). For families whose income exceeds the subsidy eligibility, PIC has a modest tuition assistance program.

Early Learning program hours are 8 am to 6 pm. Early drop-off is available at 7:30 am for an additional fee.

For preschool-age children (ages 3 - 5) we offer full-week or part-week (3, 4, or 5 day schedule) care.
